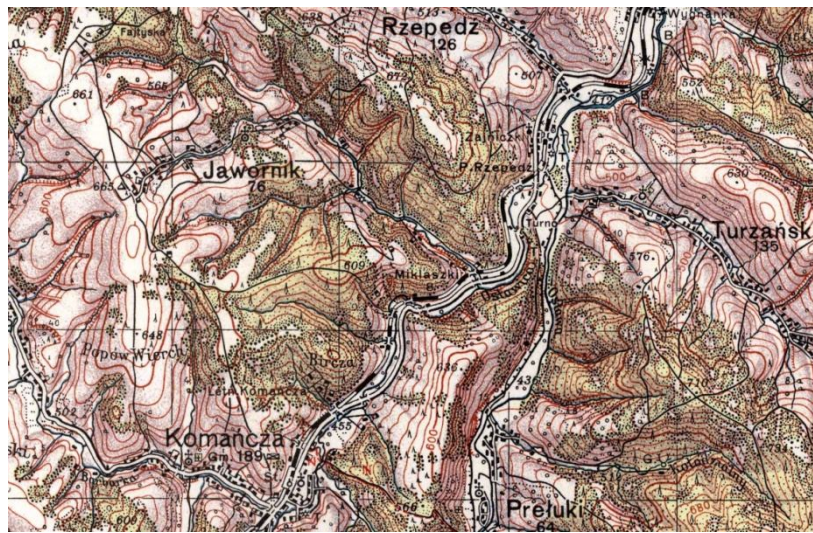


Myths about vampires in Poland.
